Welcome to Spring 1 in Year 1

Here is a brief summary of what will we be learning this term?

In Writing, we will be learning how to write a report about Robots. We will be looking at the structure of information texts, how to hook the reader in, extending simple sentences and including interesting and relevant detail whilst broadening vocabulary.

In grammar, we will be exploring useful generalisers (most, many, all, a few etc). We will be looking at varying the sentence openings to engage the reader (amazingly, surprisingly etc). We will also be using the language of comparison. (is like, unlike, identical to etc)

In spelling, we will be spelling the everyday words we know independently in our writing.

In handwriting, we will be continuing to present our work neatly and correctly form our letters.

Our reading unit will be based on the book Stuck by Oliver Jeffers.

As mathematicians, we will be looking at place value and addition and subtraction within 20.

In our Number Sense sessions, we will be reviewing one more, one less and commutative addition.

As scientists, we will be identifying and naming materials. We will explore the difference between an object and the material from which it is made.

In addition, we will be learning about the season of 'Winter'.

As historians, we will be learning about Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell and the legacy they left behind. The children will learn about these 2 significant individuals from the past and know how their achievements have influenced life today.

As artists, we will be creating seascapes using powder paints.

The children will learn how to independently organise their own equipment for painting, and they will investigate colour by mixing small quantities and varying pigments to change shade and tone.

In computing, we will be learning how to write using the keyboard. The children will learn to edit their work.

In e-safety, we will learning about online reputation and take part in Safer Internet Day.

In RE, we will be listening to stories from the Bible and explore the concept of parables and miracles. The children will identify that Jesus is important to Christians and that his teachings can be found in the Bible.
