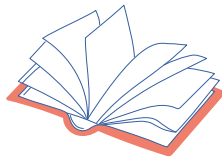
### MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

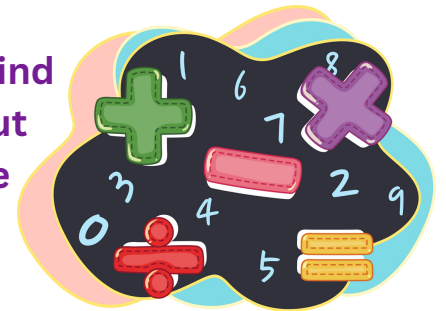
A **medical scientist** researches and develops theories, and antidotes, to contribute to the field of medicine, to better human life.
