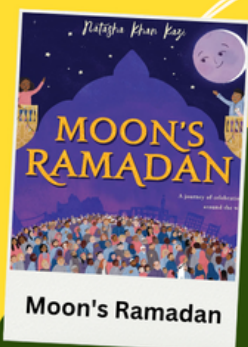
You can achieve amazing things through reading

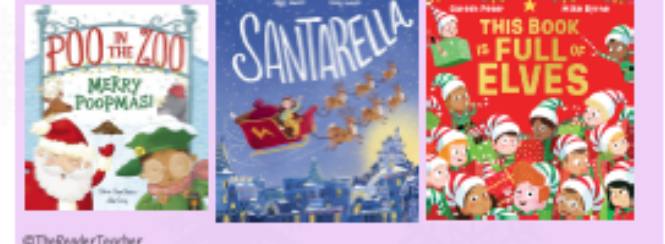

P.E Teacher: work in schools and colleges, teaching students various physical games and skills, instructing them regarding the use of equipment and promoting a healthy lifestyle.

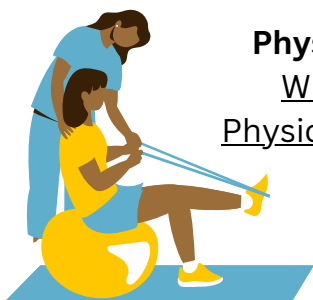

10 tips for parents and carers HOW TO BE GREEN WITH YOUR TECH

Right now, humans aren't living sustainably: we're taking too many resources and not leaving the world in a fit state for future generations. Old tech products are a clear example: if we throw them away, the poisonous lead and mercury inside can get into the food chain through the soil. Recycling tech, though, has its own issues: it's often exported to countries where the low cost of 'informal' people tears hardware, where villages (including children) sort through discarded devices to remove useful parts and substances like gold, silver and copper – often putting their health at risk. Finding ways to re-use tech is the greenest option.

So what can we do with those cupboards and drawers full of old phones and unwanted computers? Reuse, recycle, donate or sell them!

- DONATE THEM TO CHARITY**
There are lots of charities that accept old tech. Some have a list of items on their website, but you can also call them up to find out more. It's a great option – as long as the charity is a registered charity, you can claim a tax credit for the value of the items you donate.
- REMEMBER THE BATTERIES**

- USE YOUR ONLINE SAFETY KNOWLEDGE**

What Schools Need to Know about THE ONLINE SAFETY ACT

The Online Safety Act was passed into law in October 2022, with the aim of establishing major new layers of protection for children when they're online. The government has pledged 'a zero-tolerance approach to protecting children from online harm' and the act certainly includes more powerful legislation which should help to safeguard young people in the digital world. Our guide summarises the key points for schools.

- HARMFUL CONTENT**
Social media sites must remove content that is harmful or causes harm to children. This includes content that is sexually explicit, violent, or contains threats of violence.
- ANIMAL CRUELTY**
Content featuring animals in a way that causes harm to children is banned. This includes content that shows animals being harmed or killed.
- MORE TRANSPARENCY**
Sites must be transparent about the hazards they pose to children. This includes providing clear information about the risks of using the site.
- HOSTING MISLEADING ADVERTS**
Sites must be transparent about the hazards they pose to children. This includes providing clear information about the risks of using the site.
- NON-CONSENSUAL SHARING**
Sites must be transparent about the hazards they pose to children. This includes providing clear information about the risks of using the site.
- REPORTING AND FILTERING**

What this means for you

The act has some specific implications for schools. It's essential that leaders understand the new legislation's scope and limitations. The act is certainly a positive step, but as artificial intelligence and other advances in tech continue to produce new challenges, schools will still need to remain extremely vigilant.

- KNOW WHERE TO GET HELP**
Look out for the Code of Conduct that Ofcom is creating in response to the Online Safety Act. This will provide schools with clear guidance on how to comply with the act.
- REMEMBER THE ESSENTIALS**
Be mindful of your organisation's own policies. The act will require schools to review their policies and ensure they are up to date.
- WATCH FOR FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS**
There are some issues on which the legislation remains unclear. Schools should keep an eye on these issues and be prepared to adapt their policies as needed.
- UNDERSTAND AND EXPLAIN**
Schools should explain to parents and carers the new provisions of the Online Safety Act. This will help them to understand the risks of using the internet and to take steps to protect their children.
- ENGAGE WITH PARENTS**

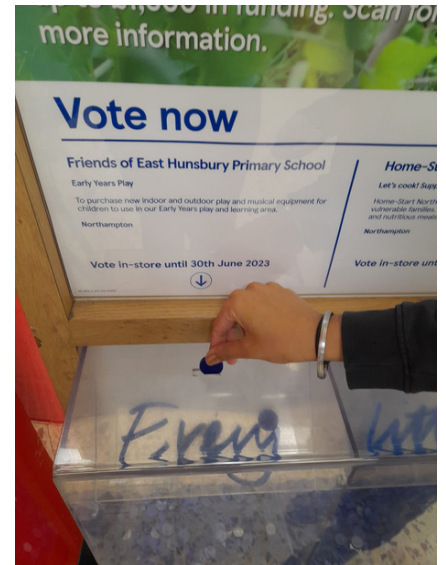
