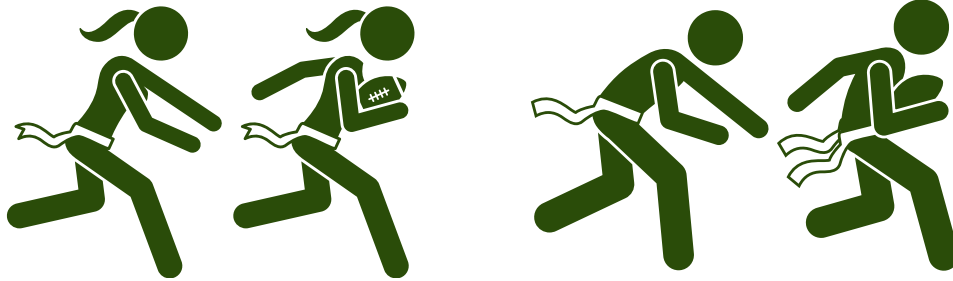

# ADVERSE WEATHER

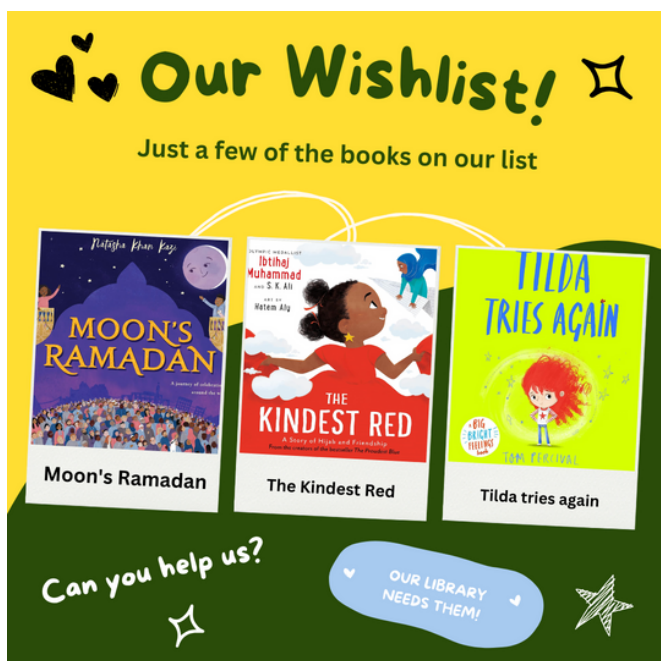
With the cold weather firmly upon us, we have revised our adverse weather procedures. Please [click here](#) to read our Adverse Weather Policy which is now on our school website.



Key things to be aware of:



- We will always try to keep the school open in adverse weather, but if for any reason we are unable to, we will inform you by email and Class Dojo by 7:45am.
- In the event of snow, the gate on Rowtree Road will be closed and the only access will be the 2 pedestrian gates on Penvale Road.
- In the event of ice, all entrance gates will be open and access points will be gritted where possible. However, we are mindful that will not be able to grit everywhere in time for the school opening so please ensure that you proceed on the school site with caution and take all necessary precautions for yourself and your family.

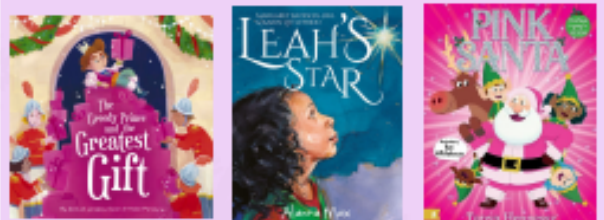

### Minecraft

Minecraft remains ever popular and with Christmas ahead of us, maybe your child will be receiving this game as one of their presents. Minecraft Legends is rated as PEGI 7 meaning it is suitable for those over 7 years of age. The App store rate Minecraft as 9+.

You should be aware that there is a multiplayer option so players can chat to each other, and in-app purchases are available. Parental controls are available, either within Minecraft or on the console itself e.g. Nintendo Switch or PlayStation. Find out more here:

### Toxicity in game play

Safe In Our World and Ubisoft (creators of games such as Assassins Creed) have co-developed the 'Good Game Playbook'. The playbook will be sent to players reporting disruptive behaviour as well as the individual reported. This is to support the person affected as well as to try and educate the person reported about the harm their behaviour might have on others.

### Get to know Age Ratings

Age ratings are in place to help protect your child, so we thought we'd provide you with a little reminder of how important it is to check the age ratings of what your child is accessing online. Here are the age ratings of some of the more popular apps that young people are accessing. Did you know that WhatsApp has an age rating of 16?



Whether your child is viewing films, accessing apps, playing games online, using social media or downloading other apps – check the age rating first to see if your child is old enough. In addition, the likes of PEGI include further content descriptors, which will give you an indication of the type of content that your child might view e.g. violence, if accessing the app/game etc.

It is important to note that whilst age ratings do allow you to see if something may be appropriate for your child, it is also important to review the content yourself. This will allow you to make an informed decision as to whether it is suitable for your child to access and if it would be beneficial to apply further parental controls.

### What Parents & Carers Need to Know about DISNEY+

The Walt Disney Company's streaming service, Disney+, combines entertainment from the famous animation studio itself with Pixar, Star and National Geographic, plus the Marvel and Star Wars franchises. With access to the latest releases, Disney classics and original series, there's plenty of content to explore. While parents may have noticed that parental have now been introduced on some versions of the service, the platform is unsurprisingly a Disney product – designed to be appropriate for the whole family.

**LESS SUITABLE CONTENT**  
While Disney is predominantly family friendly, there are some movies and shows in its library which are aimed at an older audience. These may contain younger stars or contain themes or language that you'd prefer your child wasn't exposed to. You could avoid such content by enabling Family Mode (see 'Adjust content settings' below) or specifying a content age rating for your child's profile.

**ENCRUCHING ADVERTS**  
Disney+ has introduced a new subscription package – Disney+ Essential and Ad-Free – which prevents commercials before, during and after shows. (It's more for streamers). There are no adverts in our shows, but profiles with a content rating of 8+ years will see ads appropriate for that age category. Adults who give consent will see personalised adverts based on their location and viewing history.

**ACCESSING ADULTS PROFILES**  
If adults don't set a PIN for their profile, children could access it and encounter content which isn't age appropriate. In the settings, 'Junior Mode' (which requires the user to input their account ID number, email ID and enter items to watch profiles. For more information see our help page, though you can't set this through – so using a screen lock).

**ADJUST CONTENT SETTINGS**  
When setting up an account, there's an option to create profiles in which content is limited to an age 8+ or 13+. This is the default for all profiles. You can give older children a wider choice of viewing by building a standard profile, then going into the settings and changing the content rating from one of the pre-set alternatives: 8+, 13+ or 14+.

**ADD PIN PROTECTION**  
Disney+ enables you to effectively lock profiles behind a four-digit PIN. In particular, some of the shows on the platform's four-year-old back list for more oriented to adults (including several hard-hitting dramas from US networks), so protecting parents' or older siblings' profiles with the PIN helps to prevent younger children stumbling across material which isn't intended for them.

**TURN OFF AUTO-PLAY**  
When a cartoon, show or movie finishes, Disney+ uses algorithms to suggest a similar title to watch next, which it thinks your child will enjoy. This suggestion will then automatically begin to pre-load. There's an option to turn off this feature in the settings, which will encourage your child to take a break from the screen and move on to a different activity.

**ENJOY AS A FAMILY**  
When your child watches a movie or show on Disney+ for the first time, you may want to sit with them to ensure it's suitable. You can do this in the same way as you would with any other content. (Including several hard-hitting dramas from US networks), so protecting parents' or older siblings' profiles with the PIN helps to prevent younger children stumbling across material which isn't intended for them.

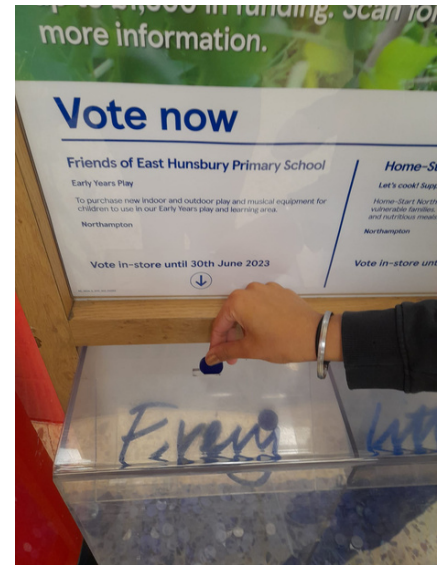

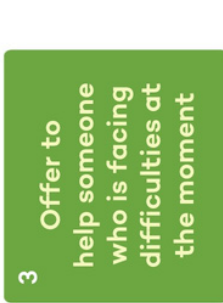
