# E-Safety



## What Parents & Carers Need to Know about SETTING UP APPS, GAMES AND SOFTWARE

Millions of new phones, tablets, laptops and games consoles will be nesting under Christmas trees this year. However, even if parents and carers have gone to the trouble of setting up these new devices and enabling the safety features, there are still potential hazards in the apps, games and software that children will want to install and use. Knowing what to look for and discussing those risks with your child may help avoid any nasty surprises this Christmas. Here are our top tips for ensuring that unwrapping this year's presents doesn't unleash any unexpected dangers.

**TAKE NOTE OF AGE RATINGS**  
Look when most games were bought in shops. Showing the age rating is one way to ensure you know what you're buying. The ESRB (Entertainment Software Rating Board) is responsible for rating games in the US and the UK. You can check the ESRB's website for a complete list of their ratings: [www.esrb.org](http://www.esrb.org) or [www.bfi.gov.uk/games](http://www.bfi.gov.uk/games).

**FREE ISN'T ALWAYS FREE**  
The games market has changed in recent years. More and more games are free to download, but then have in-app purchases for extra content. (As in Fortnite) or to unlock additional content. There can be huge peer pressure for children to buy these extra purchases. If you're buying a game, make sure you know what you're buying. Some games have in-app purchases that are not advertised in the game's description.

**DISABLE IN-APP PURCHASING**  
It's not wise to leave children with devices that can make in-app purchases without your permission. Ideally, set up computers, consoles and phones so child accounts need an adult's authorization to buy anything. On shared devices (like iPads, which don't let you set up a child account), the settings to ensure that in-app purchases require the account holder's password, fingerprint or face ID.

**APPS ARE AGE RATED, TOO**  
Like games, apps in the major stores have age ratings, too – so you can see in advance whether an app is appropriate for your child. Additionally, parental control settings allow you to set age limits, preventing young ones from downloading restrictive apps. These ratings aren't infallible, however: we've seen TV apps featuring adult shows with age ratings of 5, for example.

**LEGAL APPS THAT BREAK THE LAW**  
There are many apps that are perfectly legal but people won't feature matches, ads, without paying for ads or 3D apps. Personalized content is great, but they can lead to risky behaviour like viewing inappropriate sites, learning about malicious links. Watch for children installing unusual apps with TV, 'stream' or 'app' in the name.

**IN-APP REGISTRATION**  
It's common for apps and games to ask users to register, entering personal details like email address, date of birth and other information you might not want your child to divulge. Ask them to get your permission before giving any personal info to an app – and consider using your details rather than the child's, as they're not targeted by marketing spam or at risk of having their data stolen.

**WATCH OUT FOR IMITATORS**  
Even in the official stores, unfortunately rogue apps can slip through the net. Common tricks are apps or games that have a slightly different name to the genuine article (Fortnite rather than Fortnite, for instance) or use logos which deliberately look very similar to the official app. To avoid downloading these imitations, read the app's description and check who the publisher is listed as.

**BE WARY OF GIFTS**  
Titles like Roblox, Minecraft and Fortnite have in-app purchases which can be bought through the game – but can also be bought with real money. A common scam is for a child to be offered currency if they click a link, visit certain sites or email another user directly. Warn your child about such offers, and remind them you if they're in any doubt over an in-game gift.

**MONITOR IN-GAME CHAT**  
Video games with friends is part of the fun of modern games. But the danger here is that systems that allow you to chat with friends or other players can be used to share personal information or to be harassed. If you're buying a game, make sure you know what you're buying. Some games have in-app purchases that are not advertised in the game's description.

**CHECK THE SPECS**  
To avoid let-downs, check a game's specs before buying. Some games often need a particular system or OS version to work. Sites like [www.systemrequirementslab.com](http://www.systemrequirementslab.com) can save your computer in case it will run certain games properly. On consoles, make sure you're buying the right version: some Xbox or PlayStation games won't play on other consoles.

You and your family could spend a day volunteering – perhaps at a local charity or helping a local charity. After all, kindness and thinking of others are part of what Christmas is all about.

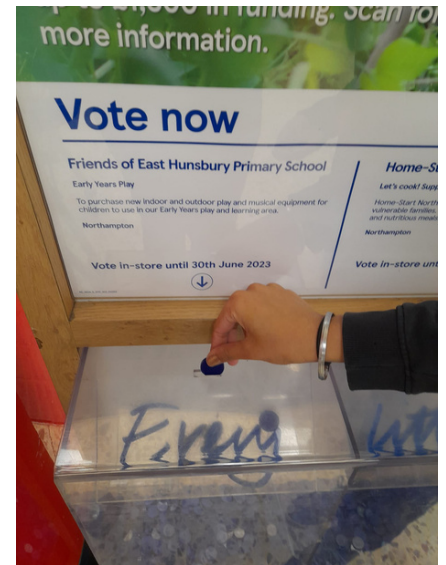

## **Lost Property**

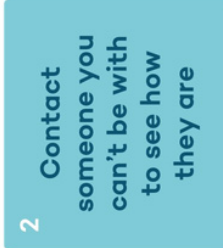
