MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Families

We have reached the penultimate week of Spring 1 and we are looking forward to our final week of a fabulous term. Looking back there have been so many things to celebrate from the enriching experiences and brilliant assemblies to high quality teaching and learning.

Assemblies

This week, Mrs Roberts held an assembly all about how to care for your Mental Health. This week is Children's Mental Health Awareness week and we introduced the theme "My Voice Matters." In assembly, we discussed the importance of talking about Mental Health and who the children can talk to both in and out of school. We watched a video called "5 ways to wellbeing," which showed how connection, being active, learning new skills, giving to others and paying attention can help us to be happier. We also introduced our brand new Kindness Ambassadors.

Also this week, PCSO Lee Shelton visited our Year 5 and 6 pupils to talk about park safety and walking home safely. It was great to see the children ask sensible questions and for them to learn a little more about staying safe when not with a grown up.

Mental Health First Aiders (MHFAs)

Did you know...? We have 2 trained Adult Mental Health First Aiders and 3 trained Children's Mental Health First Aiders. Please see who they are on page 3.

We have big plans about how this team will support our community so watch this space.

We also have some brilliant Kindness Ambassadors from Years 5 and 6. Kindness Ambassadors are trained to work alongside our MHFAs to offer support to children at play times and lunchtimes with positive mental fitness, helping them to develop strategies to be kinder to themselves, and others if needed. Our Kindness Ambassadors will be the first port of call for children who have worries or concerns and will work closely with our MHFAs to help those who need a little more support. The Nest will be open on a Monday and Friday lunchtime for a "Nest Natter" with trained MHFAs. Children will be able to access this via the Kindness Ambassadors.

Year 5 Shakespeare

As I am sure that you are aware, our wonderful Year 5 children have been involved in our RSC (Royal Shakespeare Company) and Trust project based on The Merchant of Venice. Their Talk for Writing has been about The Merchant of Venice and they have written recounts, poems, reports and balanced arguments. They have also written a biography about Shakespeare in our Talk for Reading unit. They have been studying the Tudor time period in History and Judasim in RE which all links in with The Merchant of Venice.



Throughout the term, the children have also been involved in a variety of activities such as: creative writing, song writing, drama, batik, dance and calligraphy. We are really proud of what they have created and are looking forward to seeing some children perform on the Royal Theatre, Northampton stage on 18th March. Well done Year 5 and all of the staff for making the magic happen!

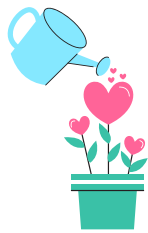

Pick Up, Put Down



You will need:

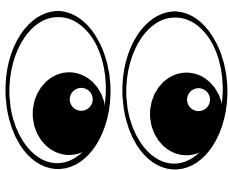
- A place to put your items. This could be a place mat or a tea towel.
- Cones (or socks)
- A timer or stopwatch.

Rules of the game

1. Place 4 cones/items within reaching distance. Try to pick up the cones and place them on a spot as quickly as you can without losing balance. – If you lose balance you have to restart!
2. If you're playing as a pair you could stand opposite each other with 7 cones/items within reaching distance. Try to pick up 4 cones/items one at a time and place them on a spot before your partner can. Losing balance loses the competition.

Mr Clarke's Tips:

- If playing alone, see how quickly you can complete the task and how you might challenge yourself, for example, by moving further away from the cones/items or by timing yourself and seeing if you can beat your time!
- If playing against a partner, you might introduce a 'level the playing field' system to keep the competition close, for example, the winner moves 1 step backwards.



Parents' Evenings

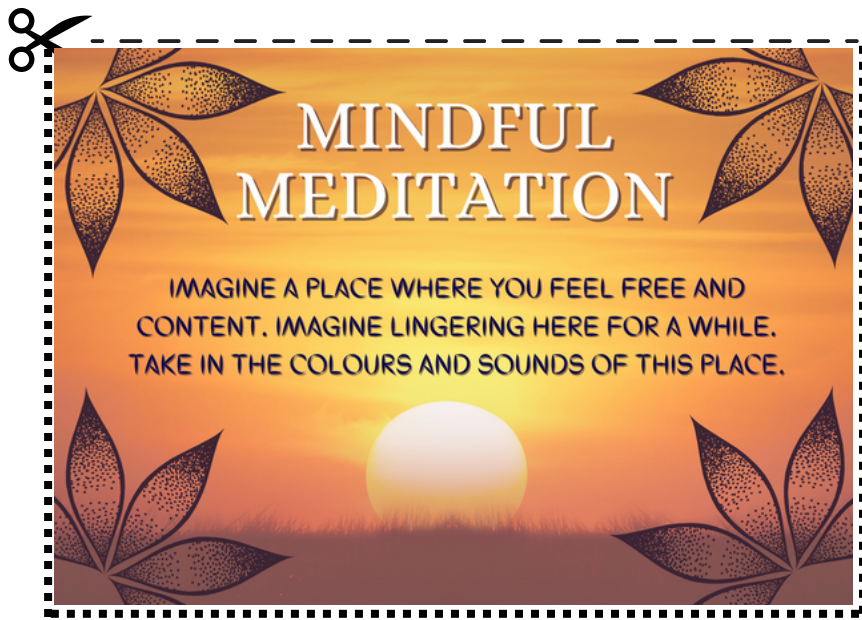

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about MONKEY

Also known as Monkey Cool, this platform aims to fill the gap left by Omigod (which has now shut down) by allowing users to random video chat with strangers. Their parents use their mobile number and Telegram (or email) to connect to the service, where they can make matches, message other people and join group chats. The mobile version has been removed from the App Store due to policy concerns. Please ensure your son will access the site via their web browser. The app remains available on Google Play, where its listing claims that Monkey has more than 20 million users worldwide.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

AGE-INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT
The app claims to use AI to monitor content and remove that which is potentially being harmful to 17+ users. However, reports in the media concerning the app's content removal capabilities are mixed. Some reports claim that the app is unable to remove inappropriate or violent material, while others claim that the app is able to remove such content - including those aged under 16.

CONTACT WITH STRANGERS
The app claims to be designed to help parents control their child's contact with strangers. However, it is unclear how the app achieves this. It is possible that the app is able to identify and block contacts with strangers, but it is unclear how this is achieved. DISCUSS THE DANGERS
Even if you're comfortable with your child using Monkey, it's still important to have a discussion with your child about the risks of using the app. This includes the risks of contacting strangers, the risks of sharing personal information, and the risks of using the app on public Wi-Fi networks.

REPORT INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT
Monkey claims to have a safety team that will review reports of inappropriate content. However, it is unclear how the app achieves this. It is possible that the app is able to identify and block inappropriate content, but it is unclear how this is achieved.

SPOT THE SIGNS
If you're concerned that your child is spending too much time on Monkey - or that they may have been exposed to inappropriate or disturbing content - it's important to look for potential indicators that they've been affected emotionally. They could be unusually irritable or unable to concentrate, for example, or showing signs of anxiety, nervousness or even to see regular meals.

IN-APP SPENDING
While Monkey is free to download, it does have in-app purchases. These include virtual gifts, which can be used to send to other users. It is unclear how the app achieves this. It is possible that the app is able to identify and block in-app purchases, but it is unclear how this is achieved.

INTRUSIONS ON PRIVACY
According to Monkey's privacy policy, the app collects personal information from users, including their name, email address, phone number, and location. It is unclear how the app achieves this. It is possible that the app is able to identify and block personal information, but it is unclear how this is achieved.

RESTRICT IN-APP PURCHASING
If your child is accessing Monkey via an Android device, you can restrict their ability to make in-app purchases through the device's settings. If you do this, you should be able to see this in the 'App Management' section of the device's settings. It is unclear how the app achieves this. It is possible that the app is able to identify and block in-app purchases, but it is unclear how this is achieved.

Advice for Parents & Carers

What you need to know about Monkey

Monkey is a video chat service for age 17+ which randomly matches its users for 15-second conversations. The platform's developers claim to have created a dynamic online space for people to make new connections and, potentially, even some new friends. Despite these innocuous-sounding intentions, however, Monkey has been criticised for moderation which may not be comprehensive enough to defend against the obvious dangers that unregulated, random video calls pose to the younger element of the site's userbase.
